Please be aware that school begins at 9:15am. All students should arrive at school before that time. Children should not be dropped at school before 8:45am as the gate is not opened and students are unsupervised. If a student arrives late please remind them to see the office to get a late note which is then given to the class teacher upon entering the classroom. If a student requires to leave early, parents are required to see the office to get an Early Leaver slip. Upon receiving this slip parents are then able to collect their child/children from their classroom. Please ensure you give the Early Leaver slip to the class teacher. All parents and carers visiting the school are required to register at the office. Due to safety reasons, after 2:30pm we encourage everyone to enter and exist via the top gate near the preschool and use the pedestrian crossing.

Library

All students are encouraged to borrow books in their library lessons. Please ensure that your child/children bring a bag to put borrowed books in. We encourage this as it looks after the books and when the students are finished reading they can put the them back into the bag so the books don't get lost. If books are lost there is a 'Lost Book' fee that applies.

Scripture

Scripture is held every Thurdsay from 2:45pm-3:10pm.

School Assembly

A whole school assembly is held in the hall on Friday afternoons commencing at 2:45pm. All parents, carers and community members are invited to attend to celebrate the achievements of our students.



Sport

Villawood East PS students participate in sport on Friday mornings. All children are required to wear their sports uniform on this day. 


LIBRARY NEWS




SHOWCASING 2017 KINDERGARTEN Cont

SAFE SUPERVISION IN SCHOOL ZONES

ROAD SAFETY FACT SHEET

Current to 30 June 2016.

Many drivers are doing the right thing by supervising their children around schools.

As a result, our kids are safer when getting to and from school.

This Fact Sheet provides a handy reminder about supervising children in school zones.

Kerb side is the safe side



Some schools don't have space for a car park, or it can be very busy so you don't have time to use it.

Keep your children in the vehicle until you have parked safely and legally. Park at the kerb before you let them get out or get in.

Walk your children to the gate

It only takes a few minutes. In the morning, walk your children to the gate. In the afternoon, meet your children at the gate and walk with them back to the car.

Take the time to help your children get safely to and from the school gate. You can also meet some of the teachers or

other parents and teach your children how to cross the road safely at the same time.



Help your children cross the road

Not all drivers are aware of the dangers to children in school zones. Some drivers are just very busy and distracted. Help your children cross the road at the Pedestrian Crossing or Traffic Lights. Walk with them and lead by example.

LOOK for danger



LISTEN for danger

WAIT for the danger to pass

One day you may have to ask someone else to take your children to school or pick them up. Make sure your children know how to be safe when crossing the road.
